Floor surface	As above	Heat – flooring will get extremely hot during hot periods of the day. Causing a heat burn and unnecessary trauma for who might be harmed.	Low - 6	Staff to be mindful of the temperature of the flooring when using the garden space. Particularly for the mobile learning falling over and landing on the hot floor or any floor based learning.	Learner shoes must be worn in walkers or if Learner is ambulant	Low - 4
Floor surface	As above	The use of 'fake snow' leaving an icy feel to the floor causing falls or loss of control of wheelchair. Broken limbs, muscular skeletal & other physical injuries.	High - 20	Staff not to use 'fake snow solution' on the garden surface.		Low - 5
Use of sand in the garden		Slips, trips & falls. Clogging up floor surface fluid free flow in turn creating surface water pooling.	Medium - 15	Sand trays to be used on top of a plastic sheet. Discourage sand on the floor as it packs the floor drainage and makes it less effective. Be mindful of plastic sheet when in use, sheet edging secured safely.		Low - 5







Drainage flooring	Employees, Learners, third parties	Floor dips with uneven surface at some drainage areas causing bumps, muscular skeletal & other physical injuries.	Medium - 10	Aware of drainage area on the flooring & avoid that area. Walkers 1-1 ratio.		Low - 5
Edge of flooring	Learners	Wheels getting trapped causing Learners equipment failure, bumps, muscular skeletal & other physical injuries.	Medium - 10	Ensure walker & wheelchair wheels are away from this area. Walkers 1-1 ratio.		Low - 5
Inadequate responses to an accident	Employees, Learners, third parties	Injury sustained is worsened ot worsening due to time laps.	Low - 6	Trained first aiders & nursing team on site and available if needed. Adults supervising are aware of action that may need to be taken in the event of an accident	Team work necessary	Low - 1
Re-entering the class during poor weather	As above	Falling over or loss of control of wheelchair. Broken limbs, muscular skeletal & other physical injuries.	Medium - 10	Ensure there is a mat to dry off / clean feet & wheels during poor weather Staff to dry any wet floors immediately	Wet floor signs available if required and must be used	Low - 5
