Electrical heat pads	Employees, Learners, third parties	Burns and skin damage, electric shock, fire risk, overheating, dehydration, hyperthermia and aggravating existing conditions. Trip hazard from wires.	High - 24	Heat pads to be discouraged to be used in class environment for individual learners or staff. Outside of class setting - Staff to read and follow instructions for each individual heat item each time before use. Discard product if no instructions are available.
