Rosewood operates on a lead handler (a "1st") and a "2nd" to ensure each learner has one competent and known staff member with them for all tasks/positioning. All staff complete a competency before they are permitted to take the lead. Each Learner has an individualised Manual Handling risk assessment including a handling plan which staff must follow at all times. This is written by Manual Handling trainers with input from school physio and OT where appropriate. Each manual handling manoeuvre that is required for each individual Learner is assessed. Covers all elements of the recommended LITEE	All paperwork is written to ensure full compliance with the Manual Handling operations regulations 1992.
